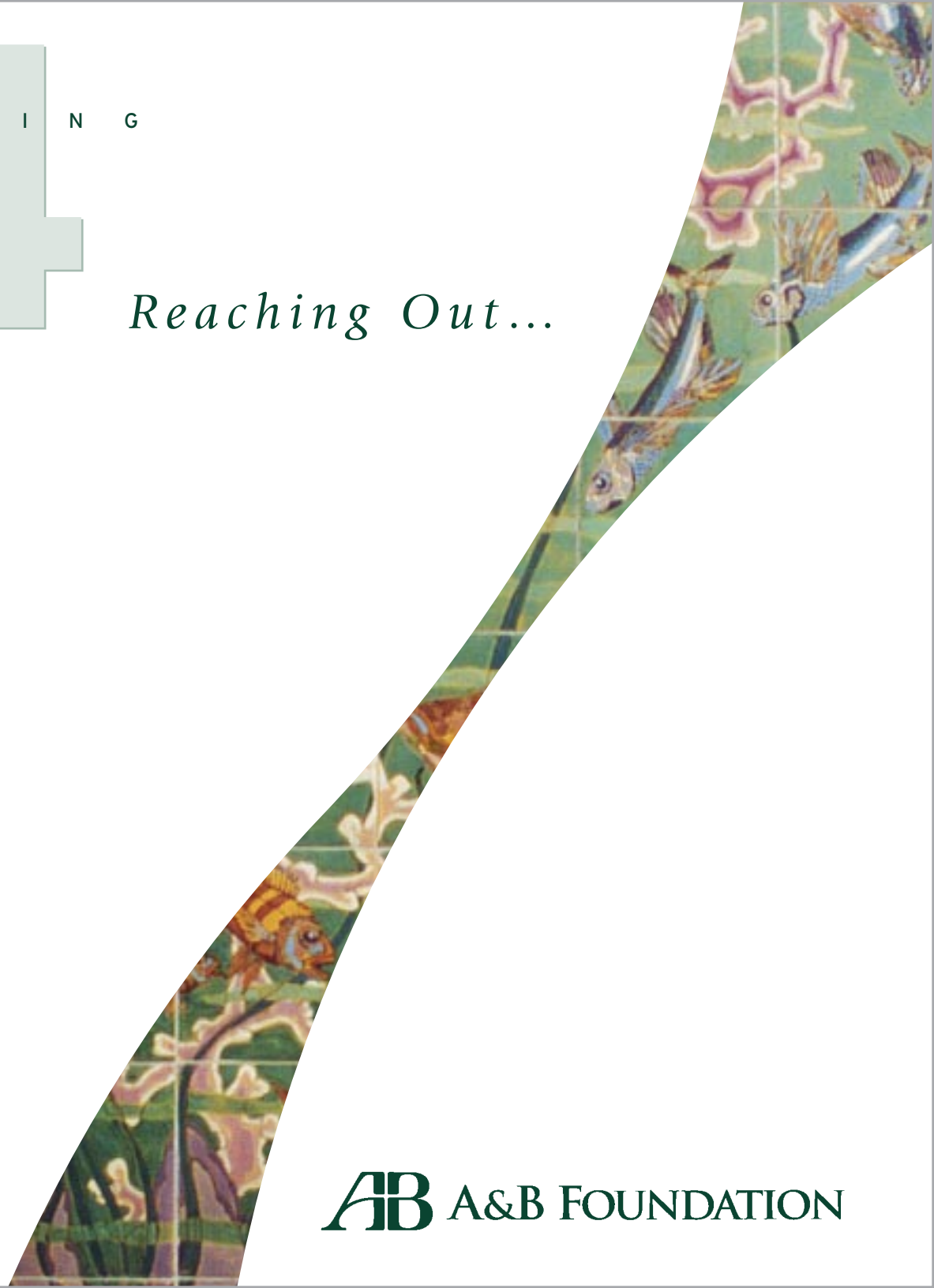
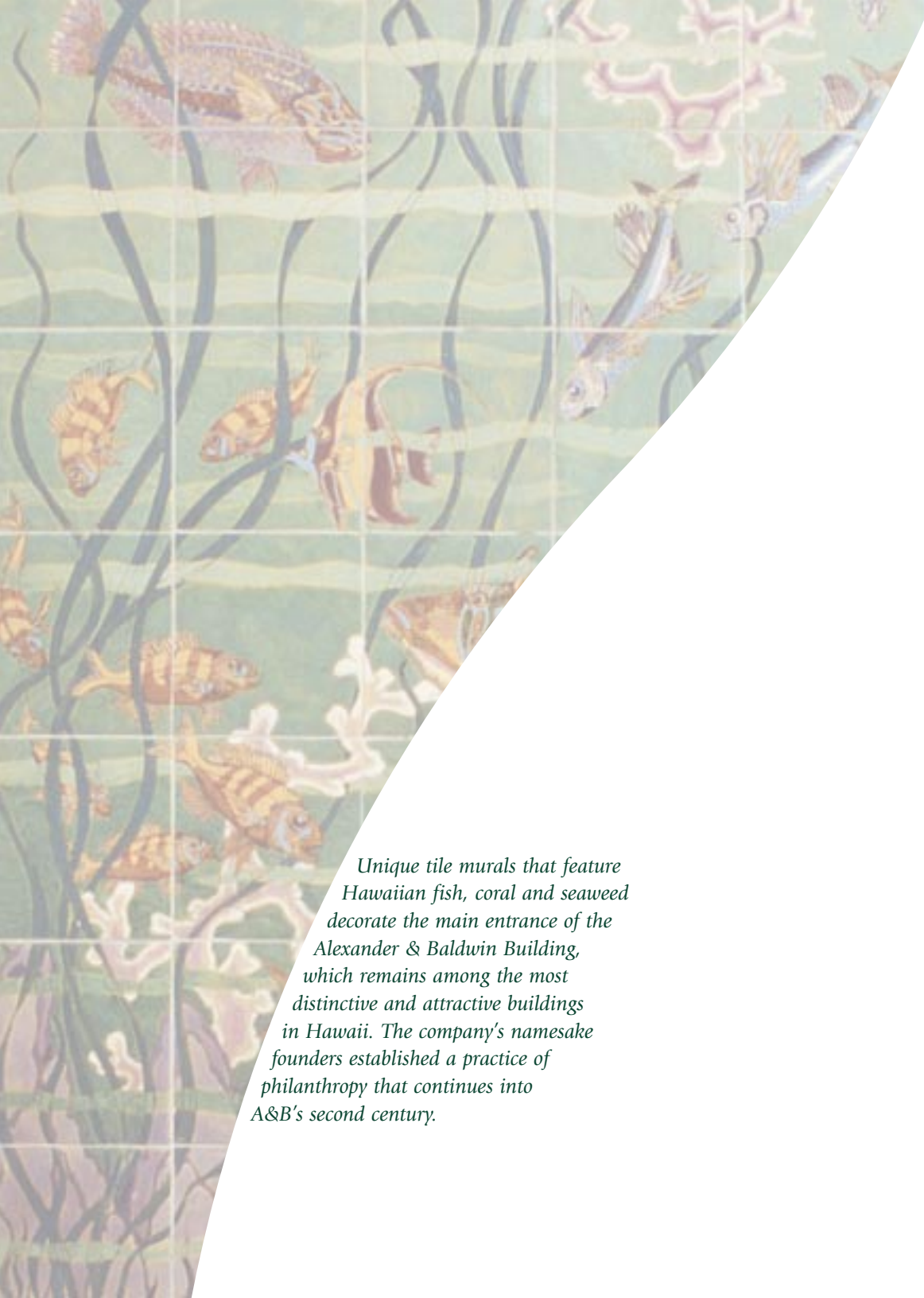

The company's namesake founders established a practice of philanthropy that continues into A&B's second century.

Aloha,

2004 was a year of reach—and a year of change—for the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation, as we pursued a more proactive approach to meeting the needs of our communities.

Early on, the Foundation reached out to A&B employees to help define critical issues and determine ways to impact these areas. A cross-section of employees from our funding companies—Alexander & Baldwin, Inc. and its subsidiaries—identified barriers to both economic and social progress in their communities, then directed the A&B Foundation to fund priority areas: stemming illegal drug use, stimulating home ownership, and supporting the development of our youth.

We then reached into the community to find unique, less conventional ways to provide support in these areas. We discovered new partners and numerous ways to touch the lives of those resisting drug use, wanting to own their own home, and children simply needing opportunities to grow up right. Our Mainland Committee reached out with new emphasis in new communities, as Matson relocated its headquarters to Oakland and expanded operations across the country.

Mindful of our tradition of being responsive to our communities' requests, the A&B Foundation continued its core support to a broad range of causes, while reaching out in new directions.

In total, more than \$1.6 million in charitable investments were made by the A&B Foundation in our communities. Add to that A&B's direct charitable support of more than \$160,000 and personal donations from our employees and retirees exceeding \$250,000 and the total positive social impact made by A&B in 2004 reached beyond \$2 million.

This report to you—a review of our giving in 2004—contains images and details that tell how we reached out in new directions while remaining responsive. You'll also find the words of volunteers who reach out every day to make a difference. We invite you to take a few minutes to learn about the A&B Foundation's activities, and discover how we may have reached your community, your priorities—and, maybe, your lives.



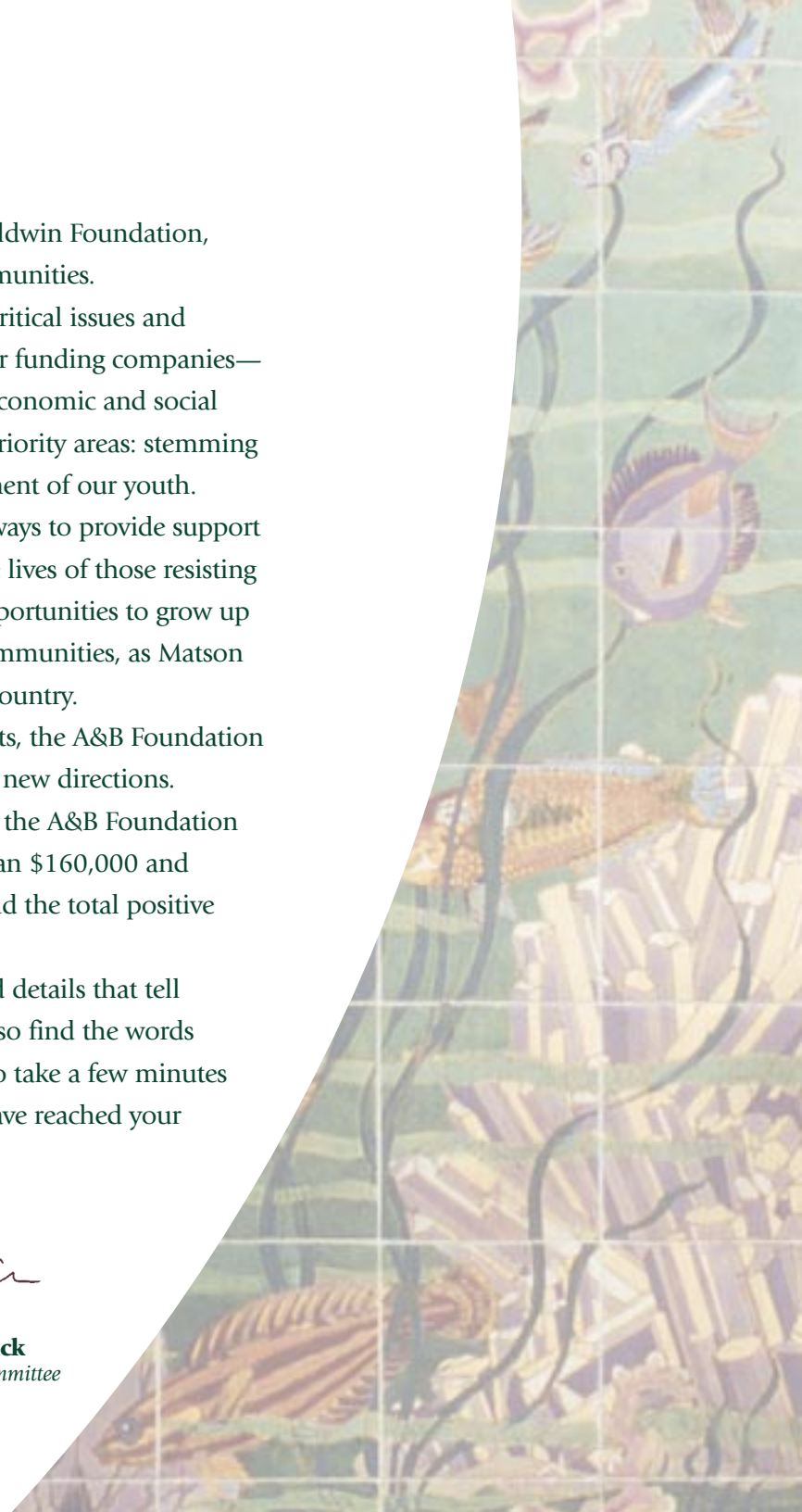

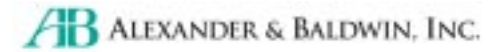

FUNDING SOURCES



In 2004, 267 organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific, and 78 organizations on the U.S. mainland received \$1.66 million in total from the Alexander & Baldwin Foundation. This figure includes nearly \$105,000 in matching gift donations to an additional 195 schools and charities triggered by employees' personal gifts of cash and volunteer time.

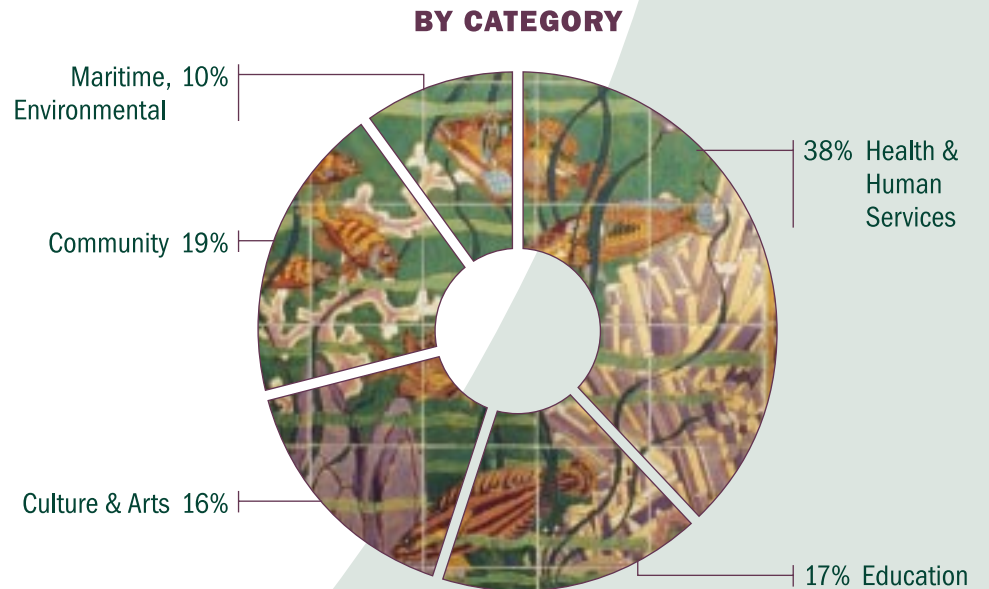
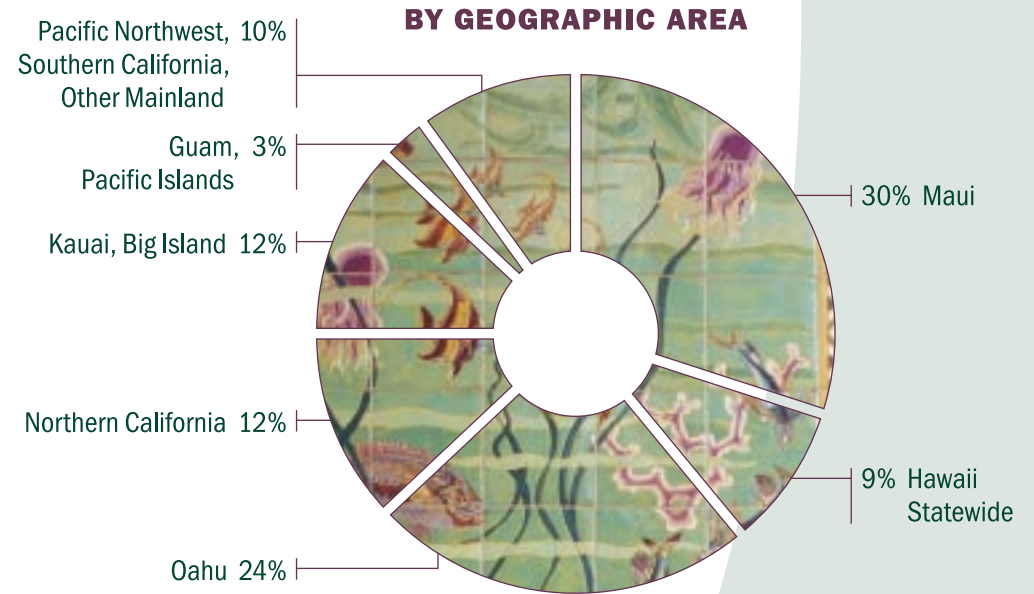
Health & human service agencies benefited from more than \$630,000; educational causes received roughly \$290,000; culture and arts organizations gained more than \$270,000; community/civic causes were awarded roughly \$315,000; and environmental and maritime organizations were granted more than \$150,000.

The awards from the A&B Foundation ranged from start-up funding to major capital support, in grants sized from \$100 to \$135,000. The majority of our awards were below \$5,000.

This year, multi-year pledges were completed to the Smithsonian Institution (totaling \$100,000), Maui Arts & Cultural Center (\$100,000) and Hawaii Public Radio (\$45,000) and we made new commitments to Island School (Kauai, \$40,000) and Punahou School (Oahu, \$100,000).

Reaching Out

Early in the year, A&B employees gathered to help define the critical issues they perceived as barriers to progress in their communities. With priorities clearly identified, and the support of Foundation leadership, here's how the A&B Foundation reached out...

DRUGS:

- Lead funding to support an educational, preventative effort, the development of a feature-length documentary and workplace drug awareness videos.
- Monies to initiate and support new rehabilitation/reintegration programs on Maui for drug offenders.

Pacific Arts Foundation
\$40,000

The A&B Foundation reached out to initiate a partnership with business and labor groups in an unprecedented effort to build awareness of and open discussion on the impacts of illegal drug use in the community and in Hawaii's workplaces. Major support for the teen-focused documentary *Life or Meth*—broadcast statewide and distributed for additional use—was followed by funding to develop videos tailored for use in workplace settings. This was a first step on a long journey to reclaim many lives, and prevent addiction from spreading. (photo at left)

MEO-BEST Program
\$10,000

The BEST program (Being Empowered and Safe Together) helps Maui Community Correctional Center inmates—many being former drug offenders—transition from prison and reintegrate to the community. An important cultural component, the halau Na Pa'ahao Maoli, teaches participants to reconnect with the Hawaiian culture and their families—regardless of ethnicity. A&B learned of the halau's needs for sound equipment, hula implements and costumes for the participants who perform in the community several times a month, and provided funding for these needs. Friends of the Maui Drug Court
\$25,000

Under the Drug Court program, non-violent first-time defendants facing drug-related charges may be offered rehabilitation and monitoring in lieu of trial and possible incarceration. Participants who are successful in completing the 18-month 'outpatient' program, along with their families will need ongoing support, important after-care programs and reinforcement of their commitment to be clean and sober. A&B Foundation's grant will establish a formal program that supports Drug Court graduates and their families during 2005 and 2006.

HOUSING:

- Resources were directed to bring to Kauai, in 2005, inaugural events to help first-time homebuyers prepare for home ownership.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT:

- Funds to help establish a volunteer-recruitment program for Teen Court, a rehabilitation program run by the Judiciary for first-time juvenile crime offenders on Kauai.
- Funding and in-kind support to re-establish the much-needed bookmobile in Guam.
- Major support will rebuild a vocational training facility for youth and young adults on Maui, destroyed by a fire.

Self-Help Housing of Hawaii

\$30,000

Hard-working residents who rent or live with relatives may have put their American dream on hold—to own a home of their own. Some may opt to build their own homes—working with Self-Help Housing—and others may seek smaller quarters or renovate an aging structure. To help potential homeowners reach their dreams, the A&B Foundation funded inaugural ‘homebuyer fairs’ to provide information and encouragement to first-time homebuyers—in a stress-free, community environment. Two fairs are planned for Kauai in 2005.

Hale Opio’s Teen Court on Kauai

\$15,000

Kauai’s Teen Court is offered to first time juvenile offenders with assault, truancy or curfew violations or crimes of drug and alcohol. The program is based on restorative justice; teens publicly admit to their actions and are sentenced, in part, to constructive consequences. The twist: guided by legal professionals, the presiding jury is of their peers—other teen court participants! With A&B funding for volunteer solicitation and materials to build awareness, this program can grow while shrinking the numbers of youth repeat offenses. *(photo at right)*

Guam Bookmobile Foundation

\$25,000

The closure of all but two branches of the Guam public library system left residents of the island’s many outlying villages unable to access public library resources. Realizing the negative impacts on efforts to improve literacy and education for Guam rural citizens, the A&B Foundation reached out to reinstate the Guam Bookmobile to support education and literacy in these rural communities. *(photo at right)*

Paia Vocational Training Center

\$40,000

This program targets at-risk teenagers and young adults who have experienced difficulty in securing meaningful employment. A wide range of work activities are offered to young people with limited opportunities; these have proven to foster self-esteem, positive work ethics, and a sense of community responsibility. When their facility was destroyed, the A&B Foundation reached out with funds—combined with the sweat-equity of the program’s pre-apprenticeship participants—to build them a new home.

In response to the Food Bank’s public plea for urgent supplies of food, the A&B Foundation stepped forward with a \$5,000 grant to purchase essentials. Managers from A&B’s operating groups on Maui ‘helped shop’ for food supplies.

In 2004, A&B's employees, directors and retirees helped to improve their communities by making personal donations that triggered Foundation matching gifts. Close to \$105,000 was given to 195 of our donors' favorite charities across Hawaii and the Mainland. Then, the A&B

Foundation's matching gift programs—to education and to culture and the arts—doubled our donors' dollars.

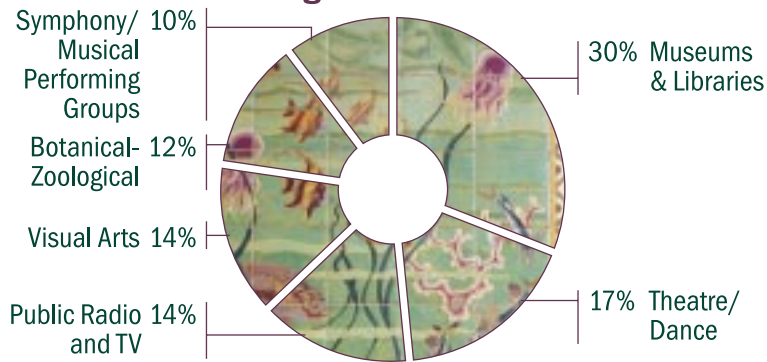
